


Image source: 4 year old M/C Cocker Spaniel: peripheral blood film: Immune mediated hemolytic anemia?




Image source: 6 year old M/C GSD: 3.5 cm soft mass in submandibular: Lymphadenitis, lymphoma or a sialocoele?




Image source: 12 year old F/S cat: 1.5 cm diameter mass near the angle of the jaw: **Cancer or inflammation?**





Image source: 8 year old F/S cat: hepatomegaly and increased liver enzymes: **Hepatic lipidosis or cancer?**



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
